## **Know Where Your Loved One** ls...


...with the **Personal Werable QR codes**. These tags are designed for people with learning disabilities, Autism, Dementia, Alzheimer's

and other related disabilities. It comes as a form of a barcode sticker that can be attached to the user clothes. Then the parent or caregiver creates a profile with the information of the user. People with a smart phone can scan the barcode in case the user is lost or important information is needed. The



QR code can be

read by the free QR reader App on smart phones or the unique number can be entered into the website to view the profile. Please see attached presentation. The **Eight-Piece Plate and Lid Set** is a set of divided plates with





The **Bowling Ball Pusher** is designed for wheelchair users. It is intended for people who want to bowl but are in a wheelchair, however you can use it standing too. The four pronged

steel and aluminum guide rests gently on the alley floor while pushing the ball. Plastic caps protect the floor surface and bowling ball. The ball

## Stay Warmer This Winter

Here are a few examples of items to help keep you comfortable in the cold weather. **Heated Scarf** designed for use by individuals with limited mobility associated with



neurological involvement associated with cerebral palsy, multiple sclerosis, stroke, or just poor circulation. The scarf is wrapped around the neck and generates heat using 3 x AA batteries. **Toe-Warmers** are the ideal way to keep your toes and feet warm. Perfect for popping into a boot, sock or slipper, toe warmers are a useful, portable source of heat. Pop open the disposable pack to release the heat source. With an adhesive surface on one side, the toe warmers can be securely attached to your socks or shoes to prevent

them from slipping around, providing you with constant heat for up to six hours. **Heated Gloves.** The battery operated heating elements on back of the glove help to keep your hands warm and can be easily switched on and off at your convenience to help preserve the battery life. The touchscreen fingertips mean you can use your touchscreen device without removing your gloves. Search the words "heated scarf, gloves, toe warmers" to find the products and vendors of your choice. # Increase Trunk Stabilization...

#### ...with the Handhold Trunk Stabilizer.

The stabilizer encourages coordination when eating, reading, writing, playing activities and using augmentative communication devices. It's useful for anyone experiencing a lack of trunk stability. Gripping the **Handhold Trunk Stabilizer** with one hand helps keep the trunk more stable, promoting better coordination



while performing daily activities. The handhold can be used on any smooth, hard surface. It is 1"in diameter x 6" long, the 4 inch diameter suction cup provides the necessary

suction when the user is pulling up on the handhold. The online purchase price is \$35.00. Search "handhold trunk stabilizer" to view this and other like products.

## Is It Day Or Night Time?

Round Day/Night Clock is designed for use by individuals with memory and cognitive impairments associated with dementia and Alzheimer's in which their ability to reason accurately the time of day

(i.e. is it 10 o'clock in the evening versus 10 o'clock in the morning). The clock has graphics that turn



with the hour hand displaying light blue, white clouds and mid-day sun to help illustrate daytime and dark blue, stars and crescent moon at midnight for night time. The hands are distinct from one another. For examples, it helps users to distinguish 12:20 from 4:00. Uses 1AA Battery. We found this clock for \$44.95 online. Search the words "round day, night clock" to find the time piece that suits our needs.
