Open Screen Or Storm Doors More Easily

Does Arthritis or some other ailment make it difficult to deal with that annoying door latch? The **E-Z Open Door Latch** could be

your answer. It works on most common screen and storm door handles. The vendor says that the **E-Z Door Latch** is 5 to 10 times bigger than your current push latch, and a larger target means

it is easier to see. And more handle

means more leverage, less effort, and easier to open. No tools required, and it installs in seconds. The black molded polymer push disk slides over your existing door latch. Close Zipper-Lock Bags Easily...

...with the **Zipper Bag Sealer**. According to the vendor, it's ideal for one-hand use. Simply slide the zipper seal through the groove to close the zipper and seal the bag. The device mounts with a self-adhesive backing. Search the words “zipper bag sealer rehabmart” to find this handy little helper. The price for this item from various online vendors is \$10.98.

No More Chasing Food Around Your Plate

Turning almost any ordinary plate into a scoop dish, **Food Bumpers** help prevent spills and enable one-handed feeding. Now stroke victims and those with limited dexterity can turn their existing dishes into scoop dishes rather than buying new dishes.

The **Food Bumpers** are easy to install and, once installed, provide a durable wall against which food can be pushed onto a fork or spoon. Simply clip them onto a circular plate between 9 and 11 inches in diameter. The tabs hold the bumper securely in place just above the rim of the plate, creating the desired barrier for your food. Made of lightweight plastic, these bumpers are dishwasher safe, and are available in white or translucent. We found this item online for \$3.95.
