Voice Labeling System


You record it, I say it! Designed for the blind and visually impaired, the **Reizen Talking Label Wand** is a state-of-the-art voice labeling system that keeps you organized and helps you identify household items easily and efficiently. This talking label identifier comes with 232 labels - 160 round, tactile labels and 72 rectangular, washable labels. Use the round labels for food, medicine, files, music, and more, while the rectangular washable labels can be used for those items as well as clothes. This talking label pen can also switch

between English and Spanish languages, and you can re-record labels for a new Item. The vendor says the voice prompts are easy to follow, there is also a 3.5mm headphone jack and volume control for discreet listening. It uses 2AAA batteries (not Included). Hands Free Light

The **Hands-free Hug Light** is convenient for walking the dog or knitting on the couch. Flexible and foam-padded, it can be draped

It offers two settings...bright, wide white light with 4 LEDS, or night vision-preserving red light with 2 bright LEDs. This hands-free hug light can also be shaped for use as a free-standing light. Accidently Get Locked Out Of Your Home?

This Locking Key Hideaway from GE Security holds your spare key in a rugged housing secured

by a built-in re-settable combination lock. Even if a thief finds it, he won't be able to access the key. Set the lock to any 3-digit combination, and then use the integrated high-powered magnet to attach to any steel surface. To attach it to plastic, wood, or other surfaces, just affix the included adhesive-backed steel plate to provide a mounting surface for the magnet. Or use the adjustable cable to attach to a chain link fence, shed door, etc. Both measure 3 1/4"l x 2 1/8"w x 3/4"d and are weather-resistant. Please specify magnet or cable. Motion-Sensor Alarm Alerts You

Protect yourself at home or while traveling with this easy to use **Motion-Sensor Alarm System**.



Just hang it on any door knob and flip the switch. If the alarm senses motion, such as a forced or unauthorized entry, it emits a loud 98 dB signal. You cause it in hotel rooms or for securing items in a cabinet, office or private room. This alarm includes a built-in LED flashlight. And operates on two AAA batteries (not included). For Those with Difficulty Grasping, Open Doors with More Ease

The Doorknob Lever Adapter is a universal doorknob lever adaptor that fits all interior and

exterior door knobs regardless of their size or shape. The device is designed to make opening doors easier for anyone with weak or arthritic hands. With the adapter in place, the door can be opened easily by pushing down or up on the handle. According to vendors, the **Doorknob Lever Adapter** can be easily installed without removing the knob or adjusting any existing hardware. The adapter allows full key entry and is available in different finishes including a special fluorescent glow-in-the-dark version for easy seeing. Save Your Knees And Back

Kneeling to do yard work can be a real pain in the back and knees. End the discomfort with the multi-purpose **Garden Kneeler/Seat**. The 3/4" thick foam pad cushions your knees from rocks, mulch, the hard ground, etc. Use the sturdy legs to lift yourself up and flip the kneeler over to use it as a seat, great for household chores, auto, garage, etc. The garden kneeler includes spring-loaded catches which lock arms in place. The garden kneeler stores easily, folding to just under 5" thick, 22-1/2"x19-3/4" tall overall when open. All-steel construction with anti-rust finish is made to last. Supports up to 250 lb. The price range for this tool online is \$39.99-\$52.99. To make your garden kneeler even more convenient, add a **Garden Kneeler Pouch** (sold separately) which hangs from your garden kneeler to keep tools, seed packs and even a cell phone handy. The garden kneeler pouch has two large pockets and three small mesh pockets made of waterproof nylon. 12-3/4"x10-3/4" tall. Pouch is \$9.99.
